### Sex and Birth Control... It Takes Two!

Talk with your partner about sex and birth control. This can help both of you protect your health and avoid unintended pregnancy.

#### Questions to ask each other:

- Do we want to have children soon?
- Which birth control method is right for us?
- Are we planning to have sex only with each other?
- How will we protect ourselves from HIV/AIDS and other sexually transmitted infections?

Get involved. Men and women can make decisions about sex and birth control together.

#### For men:

- Learn about birth control options.
- Support your partner. Go to the clinic with her, help her pay for birth control, or just ask her what you can do.
- Use birth control correctly.
- Protect yourself and your partner from sexually transmitted infections.
- Use condoms. If you are sure you do not want children in the future, consider a vasectomy.
