My Changing Body, A Puberty and Fertility Awareness Manual for Young People, 2nd Edition provides accurate information about puberty in objective and reassuring terms for girls and boys aged 10-14. The participatory activities included in the curriculum enable young people to recognize how their sexual and reproductive selves are influenced by gender and social norms. Education about puberty and fertility awareness helps young people understand their maturing bodies, the social changes that occur with the onset of puberty and how to protect their own sexual and reproductive health. What youth learn from this manual can help them become more self confident, practice good health habits, and gain a positive self-image as well as greater awareness of--and skills to challenge--negative gender stereotypes.

This 2nd edition also includes *My Changing Body for Parents*, a companion curriculum, that enables parents to be more prepared to initiate conversations and support young adolescents through the changes of puberty. It allows a safe space for mothers, fathers, and other trusted adults to talk about issues of puberty, gender and sexuality.


