Tests the acceptability, feasibility, and effectiveness of:



MENTORING PROGRAM

to build positive parenting practices and relationship skills among young fathers and their wives towards their wives and children



COMMUNITY MESSAGE BOARD SERIES

to reinforce the fathers' new practices, catalyze new norms around fatherhood, parenting, IPV

WHAT'S THE EVIDENCE?

Baseline Highlights



PRELIMINARY ENDLINE FINDINGS

Results from Cohort 1; 6 Parishes



IPV Perpetration: Fathers in the intervention arm practiced less and disapproved IPV

Parenting skills: More positive interaction with children with expression of love, affection and praise

Child discipline: Less use of physical violence particularly hitting or shouting while disciplining children

Alcohol Consumption: Frequency of alcohol consumption reduced in relation to mentor visits


Sharing parenting information: 77.5% of fathers talked to others about parenting skills

FATHERS IN THE INTERVENTION GROUP HAD MORE CONFIDENCE IN USING NON-VIOLENT DISCIPLINE METHODS, WERE MORE RESPONSIBLE, ENGAGED AND LOVING, AND A ROLE MODEL TO THEIR CHILD.

IMPLEMENTATION CHALLENGES



- Skipping sessions; non-adherence to appointment schedules by young fathers
- Attrition of young fathers and mentors
- Demand for livelihood support
- Low education for a few mentors
- Rural versus urban programming
- Effects of alcoholism
- In some cases, significant others do not support men's changes


Generate Models to integrate REAL into existing parenting projects
