GOAL: Improve gender equality and reproductive health outcomes in Northern Uganda

strategic objective: Boys and girls aged 10-19 form equitable gender norms and adopt attitudes and behaviors which positively influence health outcomes and reduce gender-based violence

PHASE I

Formative research, Creative brief and intervention design. TAG formation.

THE PRINCIPLES

Targeted to address different life stages

Diffuse new ideas and info through community levels

Engage girls and boys, together and apart

Shift social norms/attitudes to foster more equitable behaviors

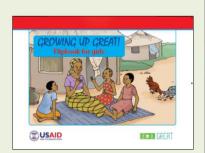

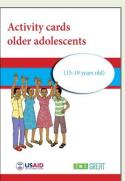

USING EVIDENCE TO INFORM GREAT

BASELINE-ENDLINE SURVEY

LOCAL COMMUNITIES & LEADERS CONSULTATIONS

PILOT RESULTS

- ✓ Improved gender-equitable attitudes, and changes in behaviors
- Improved attitudes and behaviors related to sexual and reproductive health including contraceptive use, discussions with partner about contraceptive use and timing of next child
- ✓ Changing acceptance of men's use of violence to control their wives takes time, however improved attitudes and less violence was seen among adolescents
- ✓ Transforming gender norms is key for all outcomes
- ✓ Intervention effects were somewhat more marked among men and NMP
- ✓ Negotiating change is complicated, requiring multiple enabling factors. GREAT and 'social support' important in all.

SCALING-UP GREAT IN NORTHERN UGANDA
